

These are the veteran recipients for this year's Holiday Tour of Homes:

FAMILY 1:

Woodstock Desert Storm Army Veteran, married with one 5 year old daughter. He is 100% PTSD disabled per his VA disability. The parents are in their late 20's and are financially disadvantaged in that his VA disability only provides for \$3,000 per month. There is no other source of income. They are basically getting by month to month with no additional income.

FAMILY 2:

Canton Desert Storm Army female veteran with a 40% VA service related disability. Married with one infant (less than year old). As with the other candidates, they are financially challenged. Husband works at a local business in hourly wage job and she is doing limited work as a school aid as she needs to take care of the infant.

FAMILY 3:

I have an 83 year old WWII/Korea Marine Veteran and his wife in East Cherokee County that has custody of this three grand kids ages 2, 5, 6. We encountered him as he needed propane for his house and did not have the funds to pay this. They do not have jobs and also their car just had the transmission go out on them and they have no current transportations

FAMILY 4:

Iraq War veteran with 8 children, Marine, blinded in combat and 100% service connected disabled. They do not have expendable money to keep up with bills and take care of the children's growing needs.

FAMILY 5:

Afghanistan Army Veteran who had custody of his two small children 1 and 3. He is currently about to get an apartment through the SSVF, Supportive Services for Veterans with Families, he has a small job and has no furniture when he moves into the apartment and needs funding for child care as well.

FAMILY 6:

Female veteran single mother with a 5 year old who is trying to separate from her husband. She does part time work at a school and does not have additional funds for just about anything.
